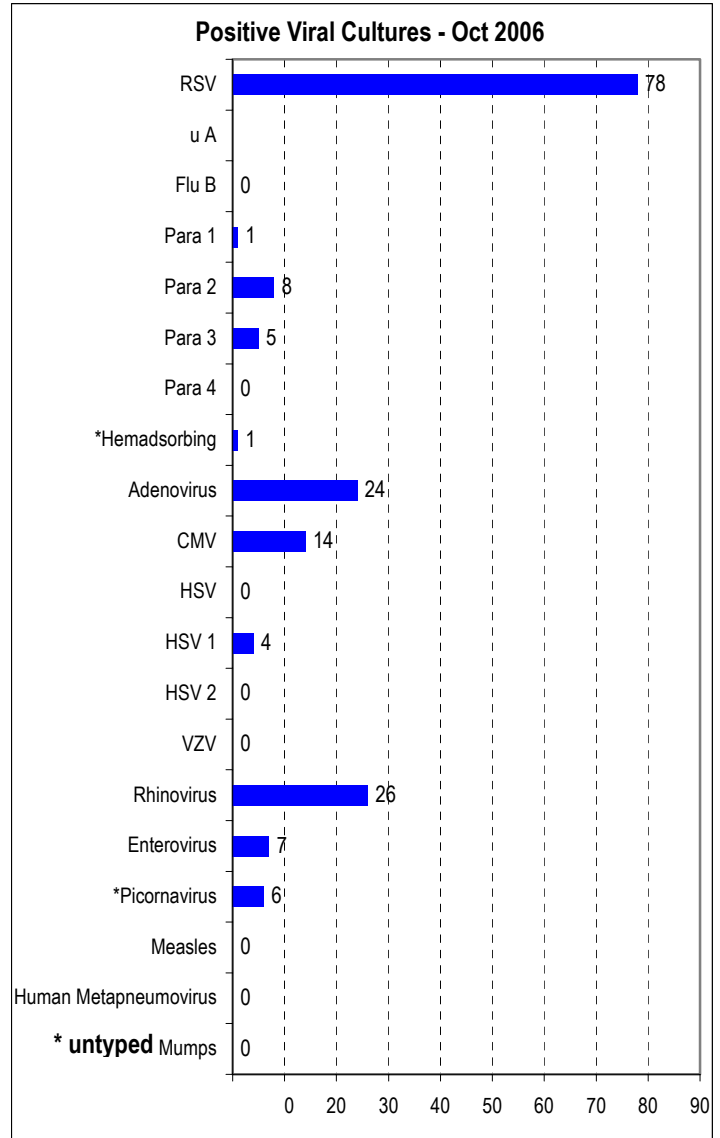
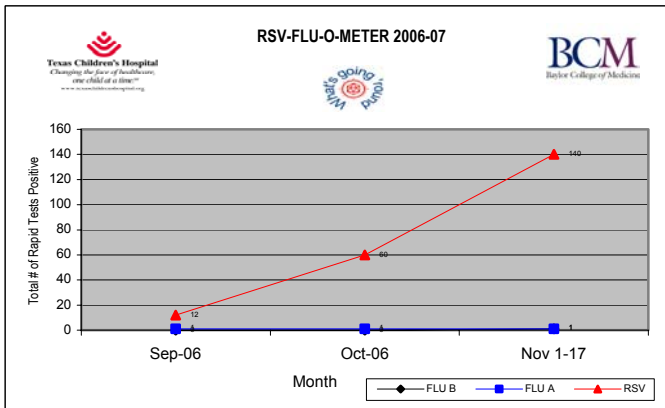
RSV SEASON IS IN FULL SWING NOW!!
