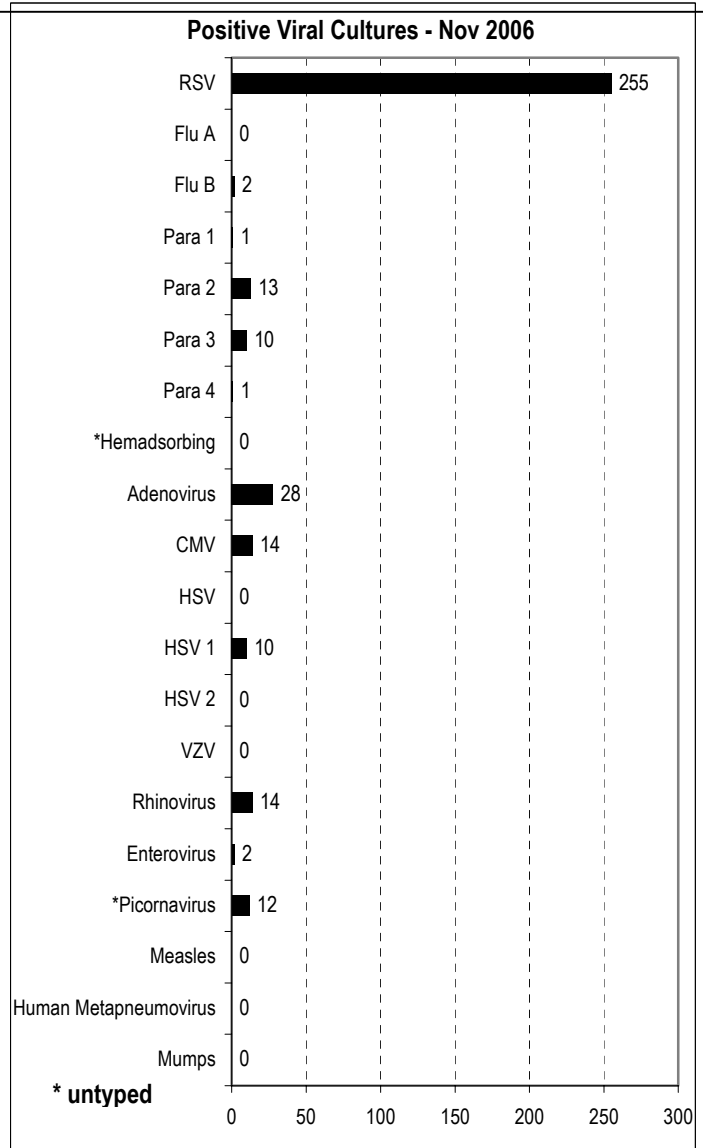
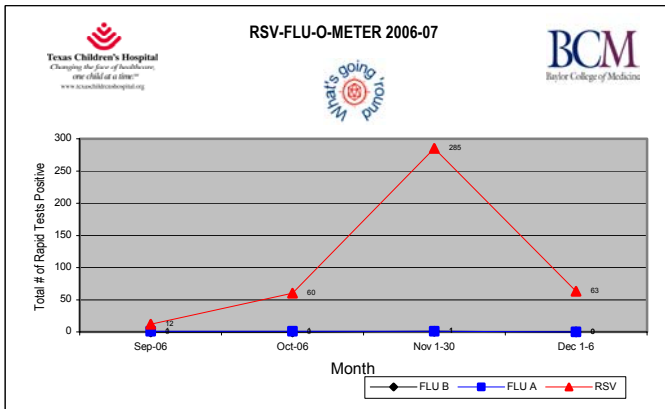

RSV remains the most common virus isolated. Influenza virus activity remains low - only 2 respiratory cultures grew influenza B and none grew influenza A. Adenoviruses, parainfluenza viruses and rhinoviruses also were isolated in November. **FLU is due**, so...
