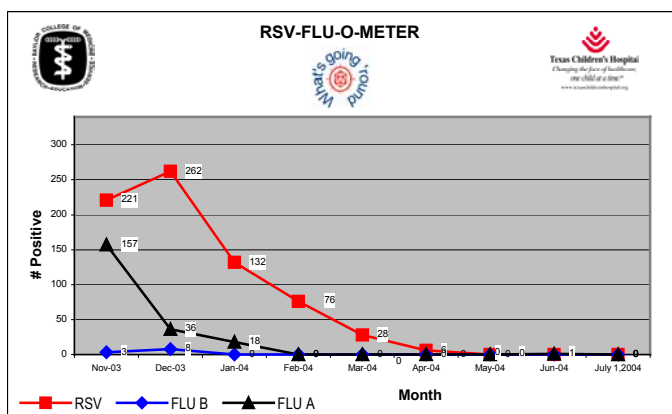
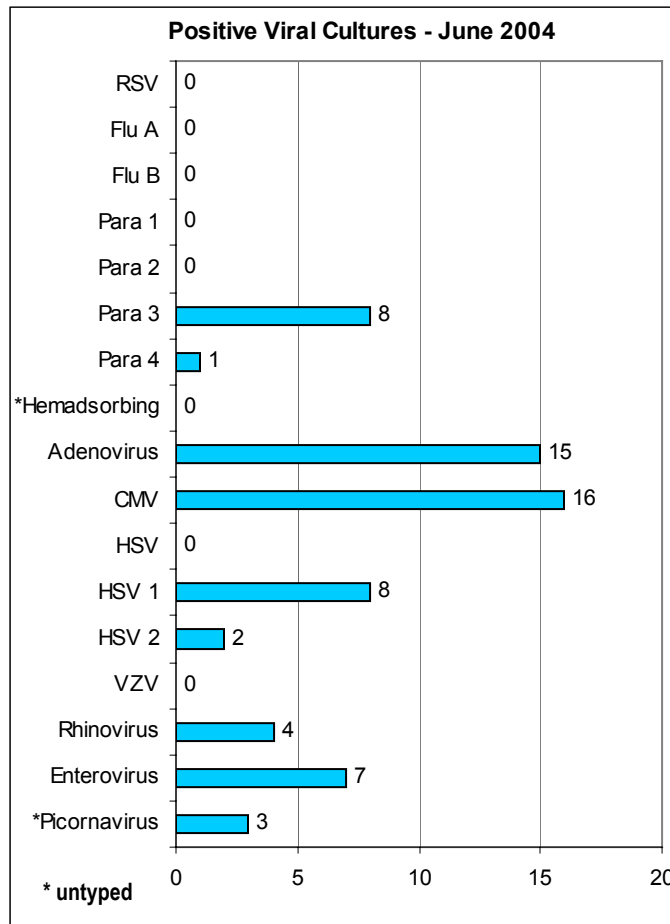




## Positive Viral Cultures – June 2004

The most common viruses isolated in June 2004 were CMV and adenovirus, with parainfluenza virus and the picornaviruses coming in a close second. No significant RSV or FLU activity has been detected yet.
