

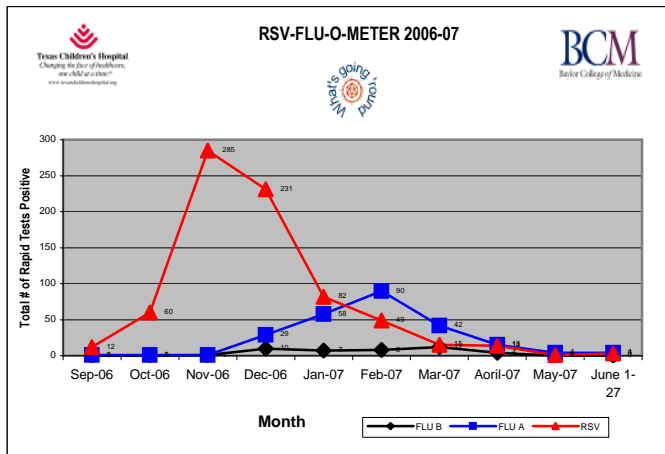

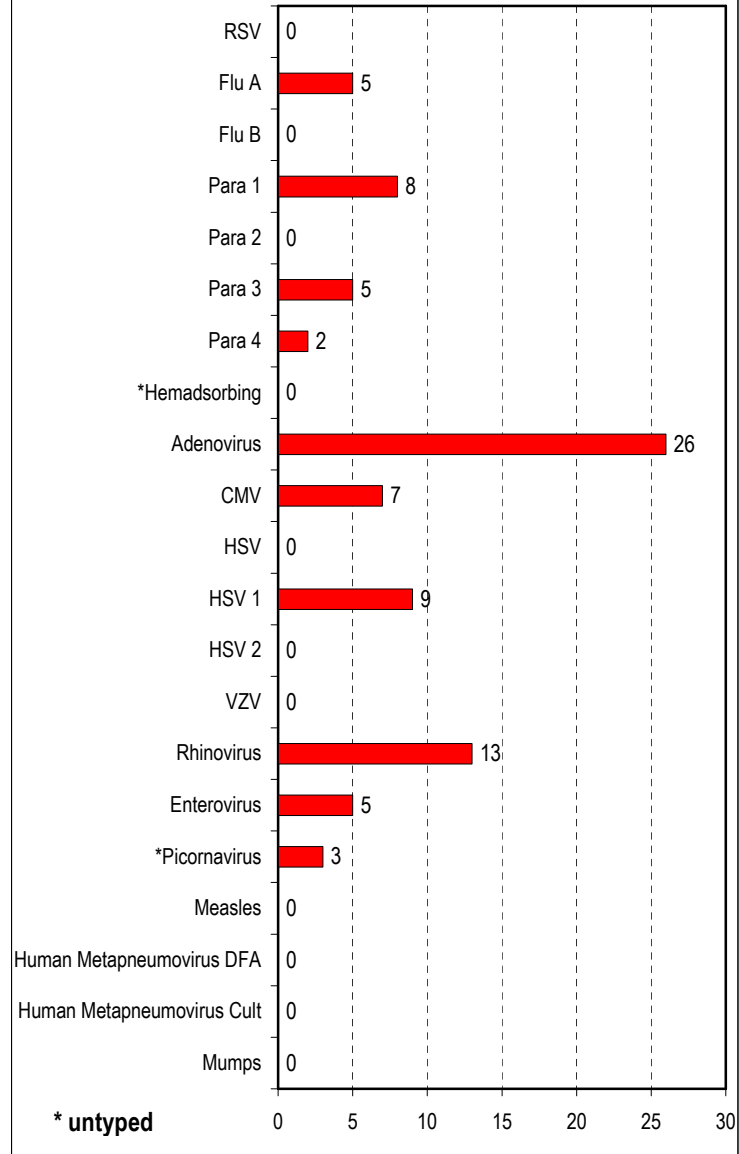
Adenoviruses remain the most common viruses isolated. Rhinoviruses, enteroviruses, and parainfluenza viruses also were isolated. Small numbers of influenza A virus were isolated in June. We also have had one Influenza A virus isolated so far in July 2007! Even though a few RSV rapid antigen tests were positive, no culture confirmed RSV infections were documented in June.
