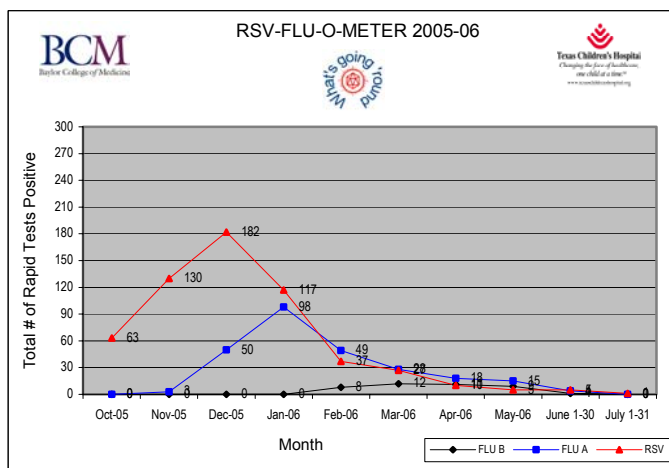

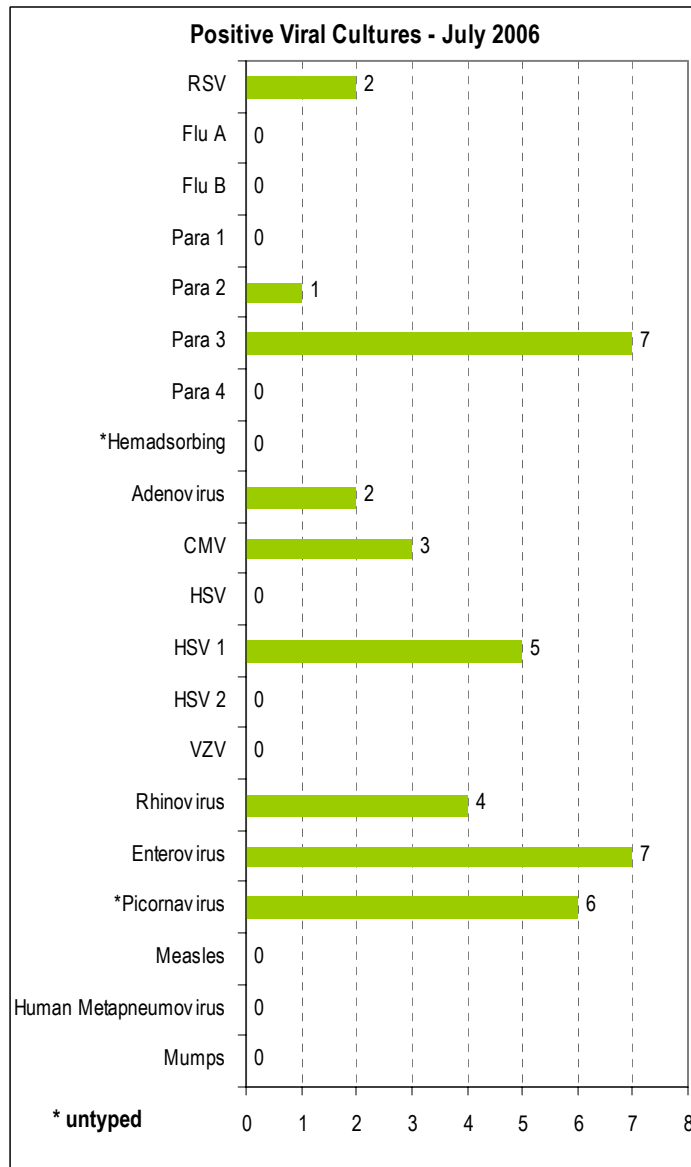
A NEW RAPID TEST FOR ADENOVIRUS IS HERE!! This test detects adenovirus antigens in respiratory and eye secretions, stool, and urine. Just like our RSV and FLU A and B rapid tests, results are reported in 2 hours or less and a viral culture will also be performed to confirm the rapid test results as well as detect other viruses.
