The location of the PDCMDC in the hub of the Texas Medical Center, the world's largest medical complex, allows for easy access to many other clinical and research facilities and fruitful collaboration with scientists at Baylor and other clinical and research institutions.

The primary missions of the PDCMDC are: 1. to provide the most professional and compassionate patient care, 2. to initiate and conduct clinical and basic research which upholds the highest scientific standards, and 3. to train physicians and other health care professionals to become skilled in the recognition and treatment of Parkinson's and other movement disorders and to inspire them to pursue basic or clinical research in the area of movement and neurodegenerative disorders.
