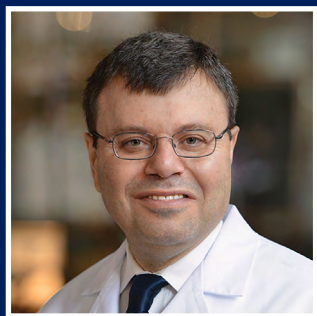

In FY2026, Family and Community Medicine maintained a high level of productivity and demonstrated our excellence in primary care. Beginning with our clinical mission, the three Baylor Family Medicine private clinics saw a 27% increase in patient visits and a 78% increase in work relative value units (wRVUs) over the past three years. Overall, the clinics generate an average of 45,000 referrals annually, 86% of which are internal referrals within the Baylor network. Additionally, a five-year trend shows that our Community Health Program faculty provide care to an average of 251,000 patients annually and generate 435,000 wRVUs at Harris Health centers and clinics.

Our research mission continued to advance, with 18 grant applications submitted and **\$2.4 million** awarded by the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas to support the ongoing expansion of our lung cancer screening program within Texas communities needing prevention services. Furthering our visibility in medical communities, our faculty, staff, fellows, and residents published 36 manuscripts and participated in 142 presentations across the United States and internationally. A highlight was our fellows presenting their research at the 2026 AcademyHealth Annual Research Meeting. Ashley Collazo, M.D., MPH, Sung In (Hillary) Kim-Vences, M.D., MPH, Willie Rajvong, DrPH, M.S., and Fatima Sheriff, Ph.D., MPH were first authors on seven presentations.

For our education mission, the endowment committee's donor outreach initiatives helped achieve a financial milestone of **\$100,000** raised for the Family Medicine Education Endowment. Scholarships are expected to be offered to medical students interested in family medicine and who satisfy other eligibility criteria. I would like to thank our faculty, alumni, and other donors for their generosity and for making this a reality.

Above all this fiscal year, we remained focused and reached our goals together. Everyone's efforts supported our priorities for the department's missions. I am grateful for the talented teams that championed our work.

LCTC UPDATE Renewed Grant

CPRIT awarded the department **\$2,444,560** to fund the expansion of the Lung Cancer Screening and Tobacco Control (LCTC) Network to Rural and Medically Underserved Populations from December 2025 through November 2030, with **Roger Zoorob, M.D., MPH, FAAFP** overseeing the project as the program director.

TEX-CARE UPDATE Ongoing Grant

As a service of the Texas Comprehensive Access and Resources for Early Lung Cancer Prevention (TEX-CARE) project funded by CPRIT, a website was launched this fiscal year offering [free online training](#) on lung cancer prevention to providers. Participants receive CME credit hours after completing the modules.

FEATURED RESEARCH PROJECT Visiting Learner Aliza Raza

In the past year, Ms. Raza has worked with **Jacqueline Hirth, Ph.D., MPH**, director of research, to better understand the acceptance of different technologies in healthcare as a project for her AP Research course during her junior year of high school. To collect surveys from the community, she visited Harris County libraries and the Bay Area Farmer's Market in Friendswood, Texas. At those locations, Ms. Raza collected 213 surveys. She then returned to the farmer's market to inform the community about her results using a poster and chats with community members.

Ms. Raza found that community members accepted the use of artificial intelligence to help move health research forward. However, they were wary about involving AI in making decisions about their individual care. Another interesting finding was that community members were willing to use healthcare applications and wearable health monitors to track their biometric data and other health information, but they were unsure about the data's accuracy.

When presenting results at the farmer's market, community members were interested, and many stopped to chat about the findings and their concerns about the use of AI in medical decision-making. During the conversations with Ms. Raza, some also expressed that they, or a loved one, found the medical system difficult to navigate, even with new medical technology that helps them connect with their doctors outside of appointments. These conversations may result in new directions for research and improvement of the community-healthcare interface. Ms. Raza and the FCM outreach team continue to collect surveys for this project at community events to capture a wider perspective. Overall, the community appreciated the opportunity to share their thoughts and have the results reported back to them.

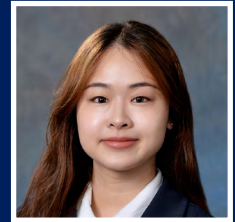

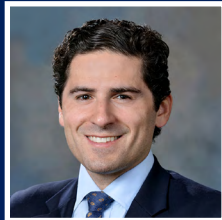

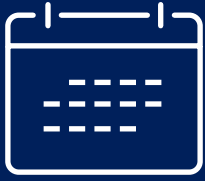
Dr. Anyakorah accepted membership to the School of Medicine Promotions Committee at Baylor College of Medicine in July 2025.
